we praise you for your glory.**

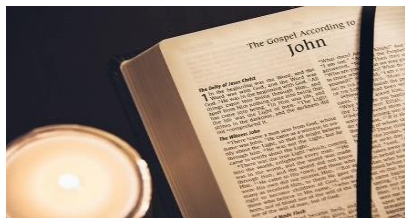
Glory, glory to God, glory to God in the highest, Peace to his people, peace to his people on earth.
