Work in the Churchyard-for information

The area in the Churchyard adjacent to The Old Pound is very overgrown and there are a number of graves in this area which are either fully or partially concealed, which can be considered disrespectful and create an impression of being uncared for. There have also been complaints from families who have relatives in graves near the area that it is encroaching on to the graves which they look after. In view of this, the PCC have looked at a number of alternatives over the past few years and have now decided that the best way forward is to clear the area entirely to bring it under control and then to decide how best to manage the area going forward. This will include possible re-seeding/turfing and/or creating some form of wildflower area. Weather permitting, the contractor will start work on Wednesday 15 January
